Mr. Meu Yontan Tongdrol

has studied with Yongdzin Rinpoche
(Yongs 'dzin bjod pa rgyal mtshan Rinpoche),
Tshulchen Rinpoche (Tshul chen theg mchog bstan pa; i nyi ma Rinpoche),
Triwa Rinpoche (Khriba Rinpoche)
at Tokden Monastery, Aba County, Aba Qiang
and Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture, Sichuan Province, China,
and with other important lamas from various traditions for 27 years.

In 1998-2000,
he became the editor of the Tokden Monastery's journal
Gang ri'i 'od zer (Radiance of the Snow Mountain)
and newspaper Dung gi sgra dbyangs (Conch Melody).

In 1999,
he studied at a teacher's college in Barkham county,
Sichuan Province.

In 2000-2005,
he studied Chinese and English and taught Amdo Tidetan
to foreign students from various countries at the Southwest Institute
for Nationalities in Chengdu, Sichuan Province.

From 2003-2007,
he became the main assistant to the project
Eastern Tibet: Language, Ethnohistory and Ethnic Identity
led by Dr. Krisadawan Hongladarom
and funded by the Thailand Research Fund.

Presently,
Mr. Yontan serves as a Tibetan coordinator, translator and researcher
for the Thousand Stars Foundation.
He is conducting research on the Bonpo lineage of Dzogchen
and is compiling a Dzogchen dictionary
(an ongoing project from 2005).
